Why Baltimore Real Estate Development is the Region's Smartest Long-Term Investment

Baltimore is more than historic charm—it's quickly becoming the Mid-Atlantic's top real estate opportunity. With competitive home prices, major infrastructure investments, and a thriving innovation economy, the city offers long-term value for both mission-driven and strategic investors.

Affordability Creates Opportunity

Baltimore's median home price (~\$229K) is over 60% lower than D.C., creating room for strong ROI through acquisition, renovation, and repositioning. The rental market remains robust, with projected 5% annual rent growth supported by consistent demand and population trends.

Growth Powered by Infrastructure

Public-private projects like the \$5B Baltimore Peninsula—with Under Armour's new HQ—and the \$150M Penn Station redevelopment are transforming the city. Tradepoint Atlantic and the expanding Port of Baltimore continue to drive logistics, commercial, and industrial growth.

Smart building technologies are being woven into many new projects, elevating sustainability and tenant experience.

Innovation & Life Sciences Surge

Ranked #3 nationally for BioPharma R&D, Baltimore is gaining momentum in life sciences. With UM BioPark and Johns Hopkins research campuses expanding, demand is rising for modern housing and mixed-use developments near employment centers.

Tax Incentives Meet Impact

With 42 federally designated Opportunity Zones and credits like Maryland's Historic Revitalization Tax Credit, Baltimore offers significant benefits for ESG-aligned, long-term investments. These tools reduce costs while enabling meaningful community impact.

Diverse, Resilient Economy

Anchored by healthcare, logistics, education, and government, Baltimore's diverse job base (1.4M+ non-farm jobs) provides economic stability—insulating the city from volatility and fueling demand for housing.

Inclusive Development on the Rise

Baltimore's growth is rooted in equity. Neighborhoods like Broadway East, Middle Branch, and Greenmount West are seeing transformative investments guided by local hiring, affordable housing, and community-first design. Programs like Vacants to Value continue to turn neglected properties into community assets.

Inclusive Housing in Baltimore: Building Neighborhoods Where Everyone Belongs

Baltimore's strength lies in its people—and the city is taking bold steps to ensure everyone has access to safe, stable, and affordable housing. From policy shifts to community-led development, inclusive housing is no longer an idea. It's a movement.

Smarter Zoning for More Housing

In 2025, Baltimore passed the Housing Options & Opportunity Act (HOOA) and Council Bill 25-0066, opening the door for small-scale multifamily housing—duplexes, triplexes, and ADUs—in areas once limited to single-family homes. These reforms make it faster and easier for developers to build inclusive housing while supporting neighborhood diversity.

Historic Funding Commitments

Recent investments are fueling progress:

- \$8.1M NOFA from the Department of Housing to expand Community Land Trusts (CLTs)
- \$50M Baltimore Vacants Reinvestment Initiative (BVRI) prioritizing CLTs and CDCs focused on revitalizing vacant properties

Together, these funds are laying the financial groundwork for long-term affordability.

Community Land Trusts in Action

CLTs are reshaping Baltimore's housing future.

- NEHI (North East Housing Initiative) is developing 15 permanently affordable homes in Belair-Edison and Frankford.
- SBCLT (South Baltimore CLT) is building net-zero energy townhomes in Curtis Bay and Brooklyn.
- A West Baltimore CLT pilot is in the planning phase for late 2025.

These models ensure affordability, ownership, and wealth-building for generations.

Why It Matters for Stakeholders

Inclusive housing strategies benefit everyone:

- Developers gain zoning clarity and reduced permitting risk
- Banks & CDFIs get layered financing opportunities
- Nonprofits & residents have a seat at the table to shape equitable communities

- HOOA Affordability Bonus Guidelines (late 2025) to reward deeper affordability
- Affordable Housing Trust Fund 2026–2030 Plan focused on CLTs and shared equity



Baltimore's Opportunity Zones: A Blueprint for Impact and Return

Baltimore's 42 federally designated Opportunity Zones (OZs) cover nearly 19% of the city and over 120,000 residents—offering more than tax advantages. These zones represent powerful vehicles for urban revitalization and inclusive economic growth.

Why OZs Matter Now

In Q1 2025, Qualified Opportunity Funds raised \$810M nationally—the second-highest since the program began. With Baltimore's strategic location, affordability, and community-driven vision, the city is primed to capture a meaningful share of this capital and channel it into long-term transformation.

Policy-Driven Momentum

State and local governments are reinforcing OZ impact:

- Governor Moore's Growth Agenda (Jan 2025): OZaligned tax credits, broadband, and workforce funding.
- \$50M BVRI Round (Apr 2025): Targets OZ properties for revitalization.
- Vacants Reinvestment Council Goal (May 2025): \$3B public-private investment target focused on OZs.

Real Projects, Real Impact

- Eager Park Phase 2B: \$9.6M infrastructure project unlocking mixed-income housing and life science space near Johns Hopkins.
- Henderson-Hopkins Streetscape Plan: Improving safety and livability around a key education hub.
- BuyIntoBmore Expansion: Dozens of city-owned OZ parcels available for adaptive reuse and infill development.

Advantages for Investors & Communities

OZs offer tax deferrals, step-ups in basis, and full exemptions after 10 years—plus layered state incentives like historic tax credits and BVRI gap funding. Many OZs intersect with Transit-Oriented Development zones, enhancing returns and accessibility.

Coalitions are combining OZ equity with tools like Community Land Trusts and AHTF grants to build longterm affordability and stability.
